Good and Poor Listening

Note to the teacher:

Good and Poor Listening is an excerpt from The 4Rs[™] [Reading, Writing, Respect & Resolution] Teaching Guide for Grade 3, Unit I, Building Community, p. 10.

Time: 15 minutes

Materials: chart paper and markers

One skill that helps people cooperate and work together toward a goal is being able to listen to each other.

- Ask for a volunteer from the class to come up front and tell you something. While the person is talking, model poor listening (looking away, fidgeting with clothes or hair, doing something else).
- 2. Stop the speaker and ask how s/he felt while you were doing this.
- 3. Ask the class what they saw.
- 4. Now have the person tell you the same information, but this time model good listening (attention focused on speaker, positive body language, no interrupting).
- 5. Have students pair up with each other and practice good listening for about 30 seconds each.
- 6. Make a good listening checklist to post on the wall.
