Cultural Exchange

Classroom communities are often composed of students from diverse cultural backgrounds. Learning to accept and appreciate differences is foundational to creating a classroom community. Tell students that today they're going to have an opportunity to get to know one another's cultural backgrounds and discuss them with the class. Begin by reviewing key elements that define a culture, such as language, food, customs, religion, music, and art. Have students identify and record these elements for their family's culture. Pair students and have them exchange their cultural information.
