Gathering: Follow the Leader

Note to the teacher:

Follow the Leader is an excerpt from The 4Rs™ [Reading, Writing, Respect & Resolution] Teaching Guide for Kindergarten, Unit 7, Making a Difference, p. 93.

Brief activities can be used at the start of the school day, or before or after class meeting, an academic subject block, or story time to set a tone and help students refocus. Used before, it's a "gathering"; used after, it's a "closing."

Time: 5-8 minutes

Materials: none

In this activity, students take turns being "the leader."

The leader*does something (a motion or series of motions), and the rest of the children imitate the leader's actions.

Let this go for about half a minute, then say "Freeze!"

Now it's the next student's turn to be the leader, and so on.

Give several children a chance to be the leader.

Discuss: How was this game for you? What was it like to be the leader? What was it like to be a follower? In real life do you sometimes imitate other people? Do you sometimes follow other people's lead?

* To avoid worrying about whose turn it is, you may want to use alphabetical order or another simple device for deciding the leader.

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
