Problem Solving

Note to the teacher:

Problem Solving is an excerpt from The 4Rs[™] [Reading, Writing, Respect & Resolution] Teaching Guide for Grade 4, Unit 5: Problem Solving, p. 87.

Time: 40-45 minutes

Materials: chart paper and markers; Chart with Problem Solving Process

Students will practice a basic problem-solving method by tackling an actual classroom problem.

Ask students to brainstorm a list of classroom problems. Choose a student to record the list of problems on chart paper.

Guide the class in choosing one problem to focus on. Here's a process you can use to make your choice:

- Go down the list and, as you come to each problem, ask students to raise their hands if they want the class to work on that problem today.
- Eliminate the two with the fewest votes.
- Repeat this procedure until one problem remains.

Show the students the chart of the Problem-Solving Process you made for this activity:



Problem Solving Process

- 1. Define the problem.
- 2. Brainstorm possible solutions.
- 3. Evaluate the possible solutions.
- 4. Choose one solution and act.
- 5. Assess how the solution is working after a trial period; make changes if needed.

Briefly explain the five steps. Then guide the class in using this problem-solving process to address the class problem they've chosen.

When you're done, debrief with the students.

- How was this process for you?
- Do you think we came up with a good solution?
- Would you recommend using the process again?

If you and the class find the process useful, use it whenever problems come up.

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
