Idaho College and Career Readiness Standards and DESSA Crosswalk

Approved in 2017 by the Idaho State Board of Education, the <u>Idaho College and Career Readiness Competencies</u> represent a set of knowledge, skills, and attributes that broadly prepare high school graduates for a successful transition into some form of postsecondary education and/or the workplace.

The DESSA suite of assessments measures key social and emotional competencies essential for student success now and into the future. The DESSA assessments span kindergarten through 12th grade and can be completed by educators, students, and parents or guardians. The assessments are nationally standardized, norm-referenced, strength-based behavior rating scales, measuring the positive skills, behaviors, and mindsets necessary for students to thrive now and in the future.

This crosswalk highlights the alignment between the Idaho College and Career Readiness Competencies and their Subskills and DESSA assessment items. It demonstrates how the DESSA assessments can be used by districts and schools to prepare high school graduates to lead a successful and meaningful life.
