## Maine's Life and Career Ready Standards and DESSA Crosswalk

The <u>Maine Life and Career Ready Standards</u>, published in 2020, include an emphasis on multiple pathways toward meaningful careers and focus on life skills and experiences that will allow students to pivot as economic needs change and personal interests evolve. They have been crafted to ensure all students exhibit key skills required to successfully navigate the changing career landscape.

The DESSA suite of assessments measures key social and emotional competencies essential for student success now and into the future. The DESSA assessments span kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade and can be completed by educators, students, and parents or guardians. The assessments are nationally standardized, norm-referenced, strength-based behavior rating scales, measuring the positive skills, behaviors, and mindsets necessary for students to thrive.

This crosswalk highlights the alignment between Maine Life and Career Ready Standards and DESSA assessment items. It demonstrates how the DESSA assessments can be used by districts and schools to ensure every Maine student becomes a well-prepared and resilient member of the future workforce.
