North Carolina Portrait of a Graduate and DESSA Crosswalk

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The <u>North Carolina Portrait of a Graduate</u> articulates the durable skills and mindsets students need to need to thrive in the post-secondary plan of their choice. These competencies can help districts, schools, and educators guide instruction that allows for deeper student learning, skill attainment, and bridges the gap between K-12 education and workforce readiness.

The DESSA suite of assessments measures key social and emotional competencies essential for student success now and into the future. The DESSA assessments span K-12 and can be completed by educators, students, and parents or guardians. The assessments are nationally standardized, norm-referenced, strength-based behavior rating scales, measuring the positive skills, behaviors, and mindsets necessary for students to thrive.

This crosswalk highlights the alignment between the North Carolina Portrait of a Graduate Competencies and the DESSA assessment items. This tool demonstrates how districts and schools can use DESSA assessments to ensure every North Carolina student is well equipped to pursue and achieve their postsecondary goals after graduation.
