Profile of a South Carolina Graduate and DESSA Crosswalk

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<u>The Profile of a South Carolina Graduate Competencies</u>, developed in 2018, define the critical components of world class knowledge, world class skills, and life and career characteristics to ensure all students graduate ready for college, career, and citizenship. Each skill contains six readiness levels that can be used to explore and analyze growth in a particular skill.

The DESSA suite of assessments measures key social and emotional competencies essential for student success now and into the future. The DESSA assessments span kindergarten through 12th grade and can be completed by educators, students, and parents or guardians. The assessments are nationally standardized, norm-referenced, strength-based behavior rating scales, measuring the positive skills, behaviors, and mindsets necessary for students to thrive.

This crosswalk highlights the alignment between the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate Competency Statements and DESSA assessment items. It demonstrates how the DESSA assessments can be used by districts and schools to ensure every South Carolina student develops the skills to be fully and authentically engaged in their own social and emotional learning and life and career characteristics that are essential for college and career readiness.
