## West Virginia College and Career Readiness Dispositions and Standards for Student Success and DESSA Crosswalk

January 2025

The <u>West Virginia College and Career Readiness Dispositions and Standards for Student</u> <u>Success</u> (WVCCRDSSS) describe the attitudes, knowledge, skills, and dispositions all students shall develop in relation to personal and social development, academic and learning development, career and life planning, and global citizenship. The WVCCRDSSS are foundational standards critical to the holistic development of all students and require integration into all aspects of each student's educational experience utilizing a variety of delivery modalities.

The DESSA suite of assessments measures key social and emotional competencies essential for student success now and into the future. The DESSA assessments span kindergarten through 12th grade and can be completed by educators, students, and parents or guardians. The assessments are nationally standardized, norm-referenced, strength-based behavior rating scales, measuring the positive skills, behaviors, and mindsets necessary for students to thrive.

This crosswalk highlights the alignment between the College and Career Readiness Dispositions, Standards for Student Success, and DESSA assessment items. It demonstrates how the DESSA assessments can be used by districts and schools to ensure each West Virginia student is ready for postsecondary success.
